#### **Purpose of Support**

Purpose of the support was to assist in the following:

During a daylong workshop, it was projected that concrete results should guide and connect future Network action. Agenda bellow was designed in the form of two workshops (the first part - presentation of project results; following the discussion in the second part issues for actions were identified). Network members further developed identified issues into action plans.

#### **Major Achievements**

Training participants worked in two groups.

Questions defined during the workshop were applied to two specific activities, resulting from previous networking session, which the group will jointly implement.

Activity 1 - On behalf of Legal Anticorruption Network, KYDO Civil Society Centre will submit proposal of amendments for education area to the Commission for Ethic of Sarajevo University Senate (UNSA) as the first instance to consider the amendments. Network members will jointly lobby for their adoption, simultaneously encouraging Commission for Ethics and the Senate to promote and advocate for the proposed amendments.

KYDO will also submit an Exam Taking and Anticorruption Guide to the UNSA Commission for Ethics to be further distributed to faculties.

Activity 2 - In order to promote efficient amendment advocacy in the area of contributions and salaries for civil servants and appointed officials, the Centre for Citizen Interest Promotion (CPI) made calculations of funds collected by the authorities for contributions per work contracts into the budget, while citizens paying them, get no health care in return, nor do any of finances paid go to pension funds.

In addition, CPI and CIN calculated the amount spent on specific fees paid to civil servants and appointed officials in addition to salaries. The sums were then recalculated into average salaries of employees in the economy. The purpose of this activity is to assist citizens create a picture of how tax payers' money is spent and estimate fairness of salaries vs. work performance.

Members of Legal Anticorruption Network will jointly communicate these messages and advocate for amendments proposed in these areas by KYODO Civil Society Centre, defined on the basis of detailed analyses of current legislation.

Two mentioned activities were developed through the following questions discussed in the facilitation process:

- 1. What would you as Network members like to see as a result of our joint engagement following project closure? (answers follow SMART principles)
- 2. Which microclimate will change through this project and networking? How do we know we change it?
- 3. Which institutions do we address (primarily project partners and targeted groups) and how? Who are institution actors identified as key to our starting activities as LACON network?
- 4. How can other network members incorporate results of previous KYODO activities into their activities?
- 5. What changes could occur on the basis of KYODO and LACON Network results? What is the first step that we, members of the Network, take and towards whom?
- 6. What are initial activities that we/individual organisation can do?
