What is it?

- Established in 1949 by leading EU figures such as Salvador de Madariaga, Winston Churchill, Paul Henri Spaak and Alcide de Gasperi in the wake of the first Congress of the European Movement in The Hague in 1948.
- The idea was to establish an institute where university graduates from different European countries could **study and live together** in preparation for careers in European cooperation and integration.
- The first and oldest postgraduate institute of EU affairs.
- Two campuses: in Bruges and in Natolin (Warsaw; 1992)
- International community of more than 50 nationalities
- Bilingual institution: English French
- Extensive network of alumni in Brussels and beyond (17.000 alumni)



- > Fluent English (C1) and basic French (A1) are required
