In what way is the sector it different?

- We don't make a profit financial management is different
- Our money doesn't come from product sales or taxes – so fundraising is different
- The people who work in the sector are committed, values-driven people – so managing people and teams is different
- The environment we work in is exceptional and very specific – so strategic management is different
- We do a good job only if we change society so performance measurement is different
- We are governed in a unique way so working on governing bodies is different

- The (CERV) Programme is the largest EU fund for promoting and protecting democratic values, fundamental rights, and the rule of law across the EU and neighbouring countries.
- Crucial for strengthening CSO capacity building, fostering active citizenship, and enhancing advocacy skills.










CERV Program for Skills development









CERV (Citizens, Equality, Rights and Values) Program

- February March: Main annual CERV calls for proposals are announced (majority of funding opportunities are published at this time).
- April June: Additional thematic calls focusing on anti-discrimination, gender equality, and victims' rights.
- September October: Calls related to citizens' engagement, democratic participation, and rule of law.
- December: Limited specialised calls, especially for urgent priorities or targeted projects.







Horizon

- Horizon Europe key funding program for research and innovation (CSOs can participate in all six Clusters under Pilar II)
 - Cluster 2 explicitly focuses on Culture, Creativity, and Inclusive Society (Includes calls on civil society engagement, citizen science, participatory governance, disinformation, and social innovation)
- Horizon Europe Work Programme for 2025 is currently under development
- Cross-cutting features:
 - Multidisciplinary: combining social sciences, humanities, technology, and policy.
 - Cross-sectoral: involving researchers, civil society, cultural actors, public authorities, and private stakeholders.
 - Transnational: encouraging partnerships across EU Member States and associated countries.
 - Policy-relevant: designed to feed directly into EU and national policymaking.







Horizon (Cluster 2: Culture, Creativity, and Inclusive Society)

- Key Dates for 2025 Calls:
 - Publication of Work Programme: April 2025
 - Info Day: May 15, 2025
 - Call Launch: June 2025 (exact date to be confirmed)

Horizon Program (Cluster 2) for Skills Development

Activity: Social Innovation and Civic Engagement - **Skills developed**: Advocacy, policy dialogue, and community engagement

Activity: Capacity-Building for Democratic Participation – **Skills developed**: Governance, transparency, and civic activism

Activity: Digital and Media Literacy – **Skills developed**: Digital advocacy, online communication, and media skills Promoting Inclusion and Diversity - Conflict resolution, dialogue building, and anti-discrimination strategies

Activity: Cultural Heritage and Creativity - **Skills developed**: Creative innovation, cultural preservation, and heritage protection







Digital Europe Program

- Digital Europe Program funding to enhance digital skills, foster digital transformation, and support organisations in adopting digital technologies
- Countries that have Association Agreements with the EU are eligible to participate in the Digital Europe Programme (all Western Balkan countries and Türkiye are associated countries)

Digital Europe Program for Skills development

<u>Digital Skills for Citizens and CSO</u> Staff

- Advanced Digital Skills: Training CSO staff in advanced IT tools, cybersecurity, data management, and AI technologies.
- Basic Digital Skills for Inclusion: Programs that enable CSOs to train marginalized groups, youth, and seniors in basic digital literacy.
- Digital Skills for Social Impact: Enhancing CSO capabilities in digital storytelling, online campaigning, and digital activism.

<u>Capacity Building for Digital</u> Transformation

- Cybersecurity Readiness: Helping CSOs adopt best practices for data protection and secure communication tools.
- Digital Tools for Collaboration: Supporting CSOs in implementing digital project management, CRM systems, and communication platforms.
- AI and Data Skills: Enabling CSOs to harness data-driven decisionmaking and improve advocacy strategies.

<u>Digital Infrastructure and</u> <u>Innovation</u>

- Funding for CSOs to improve their digital infrastructure to enhance remote working, hybrid events, and stakeholder engagement.
- Building capacities to implement egovernance and open data initiatives.







Creative Europe

Funding program designed to support the cultural, creative, and audiovisual sectors through fostering cultural diversity, strengthening the competitiveness of these sectors, and promoting cross-border cooperation.

- Western Balkan countries as associated countries are fully eligible for funding
